

BYLAWS

ARTICLE I - NAME

The name of this organization shall be UNITED REVOLVER CLUB OF SACRAMENTO, INC.

ARTICLE II - OBJECT

The object of this organization shall be the encouragement of organized pistol shooting among citizens of the United States resident in our community, with a view toward a better knowledge on the part of such citizens of the safe handling and proper care of firearms, as well as improved marksmanship. It shall be our further object and purpose to forward the development of those characteristics of honesty, good fellowship, self-discipline, team play and self-reliance which are the essentials of good sportsmanship and the foundation of true patriotism.

ARTICLE III - MEMBERSHIP

(a) Any citizen of the United States 18 years of age or over may become a member of this organization on vote of the Board of Directors after subscribing to the following pledge and on payment of the usual dues.

The NRA Pledge

I CERTIFY that I am a citizen of the United States of America and that I am not a member of any organization or group which has as any part of its program the attempt to overthrow the Government of the United States or any of its political subdivisions by force or violence; that I have never been convicted of a crime of violence, and if admitted to membership I will faithfully endeavor to fulfill the obligations of good sportsmanship and good citizenship.

(b) The number of members may be limited by the Board of Directors on the approval of the members of the club at the time the need arises.

ARTICLE IV - DUES

(a) The member's annual dues to the club shall be \$10.00, payable when due.

(b) No member of the club in arrears shall be eligible to vote or to enjoy any other of the privileges or benefits offered by this club.

ARTICLE V - MEETINGS

(a) Annual Meeting. The annual meeting of the club shall be held on the first Monday of December in each year. If the annual meeting shall not take place at the time fixed it shall be held within a reasonable time thereafter, and the officers shall hold over until their successors shall have been elected.

(b) Special Meeting. A special meeting of the club may be held at any time upon the call of the President or upon the call of the Board of Directors, or upon demand in writing, stating the object of the proposed meeting, and signed by not less than 10 members in good standing.

(c) Notice of the time, place and object of any meeting shall be given all officers and members in good standing in writing by United States mail not less than seven days prior to the date fixed for the holding of the meeting. The place of such meetings shall be fixed by the Board of Directors.

(d) Quorum. Members of the club entitled to vote present at any meeting shall constitute a quorum.

ARTICLE VI - OFFICERS

(a) The officers of this club shall be a President, Vice-President, Secretary, and Treasurer. They shall be elected by a majority vote by ballot of the members in good standing present at the annual meeting of the club. They shall hold office for one year or until their successors are elected.

(b) The Board of Directors shall consist of the officers of the club and two additional members.

(c) The Board of Directors shall have general supervision and control of the activities of the club.

(d) Meetings of the Board of Directors shall be held on the call of the President or on demand by three members of the Board.

(e) Four members of the Board of Directors shall constitute a quorum.

(f) Resignation of any officer may be accepted by a majority vote of the remaining members of the Board of Directors.

(g) A vacancy in the Board of Directors may be filled by appointment by the President.

(h) There shall be no monetary compensation to the officers of the club.

ARTICLE VII - DUTIES OF OFFICERS

(a) President. The President shall preside at all meetings of the club and of the Board of Directors. He shall be a member ex-officio of all regular and special committees, and shall perform all such other duties as usually pertain to his office. The President shall appoint a member as the United States Revolver Association representative of the club.

(b) Vice-President. The Vice-President shall preside in the absence of the President.

(c) Secretary. The Secretary shall conduct all official correspondence pertaining to the proper preparation and forwarding of all reports required of the club by the National Rifle Association and by the Director of Civilian Marksmanship. He shall notify the members and the Board of Directors of all meetings and shall notify all members of special and annual meetings, as required in Article V. He shall keep a true record of all meetings of the Board of Directors and of the club and have the custody of the books and papers of the club, except the Treasurer's books of account. He shall be responsible for re-affiliating the club annually with the National Rifle Association.

(d) Treasurer. The Treasurer shall be responsible for the collection of all fees and dues and have charge of all funds of the club and place the same in such bank or banks as may be withdrawn by check signed by any two of the officers so authorized. The Treasurer shall keep an accurate account of all his transactions and render a detailed report with vouchers at any meeting of the Board of Directors when requested and an annual report to the club at its annual meeting.

ARTICLE VIII - SUSPENSION OR EXPULSION

(a) Any officer may be removed by a two-thirds vote of the members in good standing present at any special meeting called for this purpose. No vote on suspension or removal may be taken unless at least fifteen day's notice in writing shall have been given to the officer of the reasons for his removal and of the time and place of the special meeting at which such ballot on his removal is to be taken. At such special meeting the officer shall be given a full hearing.

(b) Any member may be suspended or expelled from the club for any cause deemed sufficient by the Board of Directors by a two-thirds affirmative vote of the members of the Board present at any regular or special meeting. No vote on suspension or expulsion may be taken unless at least fifteen days' notice in writing shall have been given to the member of the charges preferred and of the time and place of the meeting of the Board of Directors at which such charges will be considered. At such meeting the member under charges will be accorded a full hearing.

(c) Charges against any officer or member may be preferred by any member in good standing. They shall be in writing clearly stating the facts relied upon and accompanied by all affidavits or exhibits which are to be used in their support. Such charges shall be filed with the Secretary, who will immediately notify the President. The President will call a meeting of the Board of Directors to hear the charges. The Secretary will give at least fifteen days' notice of the meeting to each member of the Board of Directors and to the accuser and to the accused, which notice shall be in writing and will include a true copy of the charges and of the supporting affidavits and exhibits.

(d) Any member suspended or expelled by the Board of Directors may appeal to the full membership of the club. Such appeal shall be made in writing to the Secretary who will notify the President. The President will call a special meeting of the club for the purpose of acting on the appeal. The Secretary shall give at least fifteen days' notice in writing to all members of the club in good standing stating the date, time, place, and reason for such special meeting. At the meeting of the full club the Secretary will read the original charges, the supporting affidavits, and will read or display the accompanying exhibits, and will read the minutes of the special meeting of the Board of Directors at which the charges were heard and action taken. A full hearing will be given the accuser and the accused. A vote will be taken by ballot of the members in good standing present and a two-thirds vote shall be required to reverse the action of the Board of Directors.

(e) Any official or member of the club who has been suspended or expelled by the National Rifle Association of America shall automatically stand suspended or expelled from this club immediately upon receipt of official notice by the Secretary of this club from the Secretary of the National Association.

(f) The National Rifle Association shall be given a complete report whenever a member of the club is suspended or expelled, showing charges and action taken.

ARTICLE IX - MATCH RULES

All revolver or pistol competitions held by the club will be governed by the rules and regulations laid down by the National Rifle Association of America, approved by the National Board for the Promotion of Rifle Practice and the Secretary of the Army and/or the United States Revolver Association, depending upon the nature and type of competition.


ARTICLE X - DISSOLUTION

Upon the dissolution of the club, after paying or adequately providing for all debts and obligations of the corporation, the Directors shall dispose of the remaining assets of the club by merging with a selected organization with similar aims and purposes.

ARTICLE XI - AMENDMENTS

Any proposed amendments to these bylaws may be introduced by any member of the club at any annual meeting or special meeting called for the purpose. Such proposed amendments must be submitted to the National Rifle Association for approval. After they have been approved by the NRA they must be acted upon by the club membership at an annual meeting or a special meeting called for the purpose, provided a copy of the approved amendment has been sent to each club member by United States mail at least ten days previous to the meeting. A two-thirds vote of the members present will be necessary to pass or reject it.
